If you have old paint left over from a home improvement project and you need to get rid of it, there are several options. First, consider storing it in case you need to do some touch-up work later. With a well-sealed lid, paint can last many years. You may also find a way to donate your old paint to a school, church, or a neighbor in need.

Disposal of Latex Paint

Allow latex paint to dry in a safe place away from pets and children. One method is to pour the paint into a box or bag filled with an absorbent material such as shredded newspaper or cat litter. Once the paint has dried it may be thrown away with your regular trash.

Disposal of Solvent-Based Paint

Do not attempt to dry solvent-based paint. If it happens to have already dried in the can you may dispose of it with your regular trash. If it is still liquid, bring it to our Household Hazardous Collection Day.

Persons with disabilities.
