DECLARATION OF STATE OF EMERGENCY

Approval for a proclamation declaring a state of emergency for Cleveland County due to the COVID-19 pandemic that is impacting people all over the world. Several surrounding counties, including Gaston County and Lincoln County, have already approved a Proclamation of a State of Emergency. There are three main reasons a county can declare a state of emergency:

- Heighten community awareness of a situation
- Position the county to receive reimbursement from State or Federal Authorities for unscheduled expenses incurred during the emergency
- To allow the Board, if necessary, to impose more stringent rules than are imposed under the state emergency declaration

<u>ACTION:</u> Commissioner Hardin made the motion, seconded by Commissioner Whetstine, and unanimously adopted by the Board, to approve the proclamation of a State of Emergency for Cleveland County.

PROCLAMATION OF A STATE OF EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the coronavirus ("COVID-19"), also referred to as severe acute respiratory coronavirus 2 ("SARS-CoV-2"), is a new strain of coronavirus previously unidentified in humans that can spread from person to person;

WHEREAS, COVID-19 can result in serious illness or death;

WHEREAS, in response to the global spread of this virus and the disease it causes, the World Health Organization has declared COVID-19 a Public Health Emergency of International Concern; the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention ("CDC") has warned of the high public health threat posed by COVID-19 globally and in the United States and has deemed it necessary to prohibit or restrict travel to areas designated by the CDC: the United States Department of Health and Human Services Secretary has declared a public health emergency in the United States for COVID-19; and the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services ("NCDHHS") confirmed multiple cases of COVID-19 in North Carolina as of March 10, 2020;

WHEREAS, Governor Roy Cooper, by Executive Order No. 116, declared a State of Emergency for the State of North Carolina on March 10, 2020 that addresses response and protective actions to prevent the spread of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, in consultation with health care professionals and based upon guidance from the CDC and NCDHHS, arrangements must be made immediately to take such actions as are deemed necessary and appropriate to ensure that COVID-19 remains controlled and that residents and visitors in Cleveland County remain safe and secure.

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority contained in Article 1A of N.C.G.S. § Chapter 166A and Article 36A of N.C.G.S. § Chapter 14, the Cleveland County Board of Commissioners (the "Board") hereby proclaims that a State of Emergency exists within Cleveland County.

This Board further proclaims that the Emergency Management Plan adopted by Cleveland County, and all applicable mutual assistance compacts and agreements, are in effect and shall remain in effect until this proclamation expires or is rescinded by the Cleveland County Board of Commissioners or the Board Chair. All necessary personnel are hereby ordered to cooperate in the implementation of the provisions of Cleveland County's Emergency Management Plan and all applicable mutual assistance compacts and agreements, and to furnish assistance thereunder.

This Board further proclaims that the Board Chair may, following consultation with the County Manager and Emergency Management Coordinator, rescind this emergency declaration.

This Board directs that copies of this Proclamation be disseminated to municipalities and mass communications media for publication and broadcast and that a copy of this Proclamation be posted in the County Manager's Office, on the Cleveland County website, and in public buildings as appropriate.

This Proclamation shall be effective as of 2 a.m./cm on March/2, 2020 and shall remain in effect until rescinded by this Board or the Board Chair as provided above.




PUBLIC HEARINGS

JOB READY SHELL BUILDING 3 – PROPERTY ACQUISTION (PARCEL 58557)

Chairman Allen called Elliot Engstrom, Deputy County Attorney, to the podium to present the property acquisition, parcel 58557, for Job Ready Shell Building 3. The City of Shelby owns parcel 58557 and at their February 17, 2020 meeting, the Shelby City Council authorized its staff to convey this property to the County as part of the County and City's joint effort to construct a shell building on this property. Pursuant to North Carolina General Statute § 158-7.1(b), the County may, after a public hearing, acquire property that is suitable for industrial

or commercial use and then put the property to such use. Advantages to this approach allows the County to have some flexibility when the property is ready to be sold.



Chairman Allen opened the Public Hearing at 6:19 pm for anyone wanting to speak for or against Job Ready Shell Building 3 – Property Acquisition (Parcel 58557). (*Legal Notice was published in the Shelby Star on Wednesday, March 4*, 2020).

Robert Williams, 814 E. Stagecoach Trl, Fallston – advised he is against the property acquisition for the shell building. He then spoke about the HVAC system at Shelby High School.


Hearing no additional comments, Chairman Allen closed the Public Hearing at 6:23 pm.

Chairman Allen opened the floor to the Board for discussion and questions. Commissioner Hutchins commented on the previous two shell building projects the County has partnered with the City of Shelby and the success of those projects. Commissioner Whetstine spoke of a previous public hearing held when the property was originally transferred to the City of Shelby to allow them to take the lead with this project. The County is administering the loan for Job Ready Shell Building 3. He advised this project has been brought before the Board on several occasions since its inception.

JOB READY SHELL BUILDING 3 – INSTALLMENT FINANCING

Chairman Allen called Finance Director Lucas Jackson to the podium to present the Installment Financing for Job Ready Shell Building 3. The County has contracted with Davenport & Company LLC to distribute a Request for Proposals (RFP) to secure a commitment for a direct bank loan evidenced by an Installment Financing Agreement to finance a shell building project and associated costs in the amount of \$6,000,000. The construction of the proposed Shell Building 3 is a joint project with the City of Shelby and all costs associated with this project will be split equally with the city upon sale of the property. The RFP was distributed to over fifty national, regional, and local lending institutions. As part of the RFP process, responding institutions were asked to provide taxable interest rates for a five-year and ten-year amortization term. Through this process, the County was able to secure two responses to the RFP, including:

- 1. Sterling National Bank
- 2. Truist Bank Formerly Branch Banking & Trust or BB&T

During the due diligence process with the banks, there were no concerns expressed related to the County's credit or ability to borrow the funds.


Overview of rates received:

- 1. Sterling National Bank
 - -5 Year fixed interest at 2.9%
 - -Prepayment Provision with a penalty of early pay off
- 2. Truist Bank
 - -5 Year fixed interest at 1.8%
 - -10 Year fixed interest at 2.19%
 - -Flexibility to pay off at any time without penalty

Based upon review of the proposals, related analyses, discussions with the City of Shelby and Bond Counsel, the recommendation is that the County select the Truist ten-year taxable proposal. While it is the County's desire to sell the facility and prepay the loan prior to the first principal payment, the 10-year term would minimize any principal payments required should the sale take longer than one year. Additionally, the Truist ten-year taxable proposal provides the lowest annual debt service cost and the proposal provides flexibility to prepay or refinance the loan at any time in whole without penalty, which will allow the County to prepay the loan as soon as the property is sold. The annual debt service payment of approximately \$675,000 is to be split with the City of Shelby in the event property is not sold for economic development by the date first Debt Service Payment on April 1, 2021. Mr. Jackson reviewed the following PowerPoint to the Board.







Chairman Allen opened the floor to the Board for questions and discussion. Commissioner Bridges stated he anticipates the Job Ready Shell Building 3 to sell quickly based on the previous two shell building projects.

Commissioner Hardin inquired when the proposed start day is for construction. Mr. Jackson stated if approved, the building would begin immediately with an anticipated completion date in December. County Manager Brian Epley advised there is already a high level of interest from several companies for this project site.

Chairman Allen opened the Public Hearing at 6:30 pm for anyone wanting to speak for or against Job Ready Shell Building 3 – Installment Financing. (*Legal Notice was published in the Shelby Star on Thursday, March 5*, 2020).

Hearing no comments, Chairman Allen closed the Public Hearing at 7:31 pm.

<u>ACTION:</u> Commissioner Whetstine made the motion, seconded by Commissioner Hutchins, and unanimously adopted by the Board, to approve the installment financing for Job Ready Shell Building 3.
