<u>COMMISSIONER RONALD HAWKINS: FORMALLY EXCUSED FROM REMAINDER OF</u> <u>MEETING</u>

PORTER YELTON, CLEVELAND COUNTY SCHOOLS GEOGRAPHY BOWL WINNER

Jo Boggs presented Porter Yelton with a Certificate of Recognition that read as follows:

<u>PLANNING DEPARTMENT: ZONING MAP AMENDMENT – DAVID SETTLE (2221 S. POST</u> <u>ROAD) (Case #07-02)</u>

Bill McCarter, Planning Director, reviewed that David Settle has presented a petition to rezone

approximately 2.6 acres located at 2221 S. Post Road (NC180) from Neighborhood Business (NBCP) to

General Business (GBCP).

He provided background information as follows:

Existing Land Use: The property has a vacant commercial building, and was last occupied by a propane distributor. Surrounding land uses are predominantly residential, single family homes on either side or a mobile home park across the street.

Future Land Use: Commercial Node.

Utilities: Public water provided by Cleveland County Sanitary District, no sewer.

Transportation: NC180 is considered a major thoroughfare.

Mr. McCarter also reviewed the following recommendations from the Planning Board and the

Planning Consultant:

<u>Chuck Nance, Planning Consultant, Isothermal Planning and Development Commission: Deny</u> Since the General Business Zoning District allows so many more commercial uses than the Neighborhood Business classification, rezoning of a single parcel to GB borders on "arbitrary and capricious". Usually NB acts as a buffer between commercial and residential uses, but in this case a more intensive commercial use would be allowed between two single-family homes.

John McCulloch, Chairman, Cleveland County Planning Board: Approve

The Planning Board voted to recommend that the rezoning be approved, citing compliance with the current land use plan.

Conforms with the 2015 Land Use Plan

This property is located with a Commercial Node encompassing the intersection of NC180 and Sulphur Springs Road.

Surrounding Properties Existing single family residential on both side, and a mobile home park across the street.

Non-Conforming Uses None, the last tenant was a used clothing store.

Adequate Utilities & Roads NC 180 is a major thoroughfare. Public water is provided by CCSD, no sewer available.

Vice-Chairman Holbrook opened the public hearing. (Public notice of this hearing was

accomplished in accordance with the mandates of NCGS 153A-343, with legal advertisements published

in the <u>Star</u> on March 23 and March 30, 2007.)

<u>Roger Owens</u>: Mr. Owens owns the property next door to the property in question. Mr. Owens concern

was that "general business" included uses such as "alcoholic beverages, gambling and bar rooms." He

also explained that there are four or five churches and several daycares in the area.

Commissioner Hutchins explained to Mr. Owens that in order for the property to have a gambling establishment, this property must go through the Zoning Board of Adjustment. Alcohol is not allowed to be sold in this area.

David Settle: Mr. Settle introduced himself as the petitioner. Mr. Settle explained that this property would be used for a Heating and Air Conditioning service company. Thirty percent of his business is new construction which requires his business be zoned General Business. Mr. Settle informed Commissioners that he has cleaned up the area and spoke, "As long as I own this property, Mr. Owens does not have to worry about it (alcohol, gambling and bar rooms)."

<u>Robert Jeffries (Ellis Chapel Baptist Church)</u>- Mr. Jeffries told Commissioners that Ellis Chapel Baptist Church has been in this location for 150 years and he does not want anything that will conflict with the church.

Hearing no additional comments, Vice-Chairman Holbrook declared the public hearing closed.

<u>ACTION</u>: Jo Boggs made the motion, seconded by Johnny Hutchins, and unanimously adopted by the Board, *to approve the rezoning as requested*.

<u>ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CLEVELAND COUNTY ZONING MAP</u> <u>2221 S Post Road – 2.6 acres</u> <u>Neighborhood Business (NB) to General Business (GB)</u>

WHEREAS, Article 18 of Chapter 153A of the North Carolina General Statutes provides for the planning and regulation of development within the territorial jurisdiction of the county; and

WHEREAS, the Cleveland County Planning Board recommended to approve the rezoning of this parcel totaling 2.6 acres on March 27, 2007; and

WHEREAS, this parcel is classified as "Commercial" on our 2015 Future Land Use Plan, and the General Business zoning district is consistent with the comprehensive plan for this area; and

WHEREAS, said amendment will promote the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of Cleveland County, the public interest would be furthered, and said amendment would be reasonable and beneficial to the orderly growth of Cleveland County.

WHEREAS, notice of the Public Hearing was published in the Shelby Star on March 23, 2007, and March 30, 2007, notices were mailed to adjoining property owners on March 23, 2007 and a sign posted at the property on March 23, 2007; and

WHEREAS, all requirements of the North Carolina General Statutes have been met prior to any action by the Cleveland County Board of Commissioners to amend the Official Zoning Map following a Public Hearing on April 3, 2007; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Cleveland County Board of Commissioners that the Cleveland County Zoning Map, as described in Section 12-147 of the Code, be amended to rezone parcel 3228, from Neighborhood Business (NB) to General Business (GB) as identified on the attached map designated "Rezoning Case 07-02", being incorporated herein by reference and made part of this ordinance.

BEGINNING at a point in the center on NC180 at the northwest corner of the Gordon Lowery lot, and running thence with the said Lowery line S23-30E 200 feet; thence S31-30E 197 feet to the center of the railroad; thence with the railroad; thence with Biggers line N68W 535 feet; thence with the center line of NC 180 N62E 444 feet to the BEGINNING

This Ordinance shall become effective upon adoption and approval.
