A reception to honor the nominees was hosted by Commissioners and White Oak Manor of Kings Mountain prior to the presentation.

REGULAR AGENDA

STREAM BANK RESTORATION PROJECT

Denese Stallings, Cleveland County Health Director, told Commissioners about several meanders along Long Creek (located on the Landfill property) that have been eroding. The first meander

has damaged the outlet control from the sedimentation basin for the landfill, and has destroyed a section of the berm surrounding this sedimentation basin. Landfill personnel have re-built this sedimentation basin several times only to have continuous problems. The second meander has eroded closer to the landfill berm. This meander is only 30 feet from the toe of the slope that defines the landfill. Ms. Stallings stated, "The integrity of the Landfill itself has been threatened. The longer the county waits to correct this problem, the worse it will get."

Dave Wallace, Shield Engineering, Inc., has completed an engineering design for the stream restoration. The Health Department has applied for several grants to complete this project, including grants from the Clean Water Management Trust Fund and NC EcoSystem. Both grant applications were denied. On April 20, 2007, Cleveland County Purchasing Department received four bids for the proposed restoration project. This project will be paid for through the Enterprise Fund, as they have escrowed money for this type situation. Bids were listed as:

The recommendation of the Consulting Engineer, David Wallace, is to award this project to Quartermaster Environmental, Inc. Mr. Wallace has also suggested that \$15,000 be added for contingency making the total project cost \$360,100.

ACTION: Eddie Holbrook made the motion, seconded by Jo Boggs, and unanimously adopted by the Board, to award the Cleveland County Landfill Stream Restoration Project to Quartermaster Environmental, Inc. in the amount of \$360,100.

COMMISSIONER REPORTS

Commissioner Boggs talked about the many events that she had attended, including an Alliance for Health Community Assessment meeting. This summer, many Cleveland County residents will be asked to complete a survey regarding county issues. Commissioner Boggs said that she, on behalf of the Commissioners, has asked the group to include questions about some of the concerns of the Board.

Vice-Chair Eddie Holbrook also talked about the many events that he attended. Cleveland County recently awarded an incentive grant to Ultra Machine. In the incentive agreement, Ultra Machine was required to have 65 employees. Ultra Machine now employs 175 people. This is great news!

Chairwoman Accor said, "I feel good about what is going on in Cleveland County." She shared her continued hope for Medicaid relief and also talked about the many events that she attended.

She reminded Commissioners of a few important dates.
