NATURAL GAS PUBLIC AWARENESS

Each year, the City of Shelby Natural Gas Department is inspected for safety, operability of the system, documentation and reporting and public education. Mr. Ronnie Davis, Natural Gas Compliance Officer recently updated the Operations and Maintenance Manual to include topics related to Public Awareness. Per the North Carolina Utilities Commission, Mr. Davis is required to present and discuss Public Awareness and Public Education with local Governing Bodies. Mr. Davis presented Commissioners with a PowerPoint Presentation detailing the City of Shelby Gas Department Public Awareness Plan (copy found on Page ________ of Minute Book 30).

LAND SALE CLEVELAND COUNTY INDUSTRIAL PARK

<u>ACTION:</u> Johnny Hutchins made the motion, seconded by Eddie Holbrook, and unanimously adopted by the Board, to approve the contract for purchase and sale of said property.

<u>PLANNING DEPARTMENT: ZONING MAP AMENDMENT – BILLY GREENE (Case #08-11)</u> (BATTLEGROUND AVE)

Mr. McCarter advised that Mr. Greene had presented a petition to rezone two parcels at 1838 S. Battleground Avenue from General Business (GB) to Residential (R). Mr. McCarter noted that the Planning Board did not have the recommendation from Isothermal Planning & Development prior to their meeting. Mr. McCarter also shared two letters from adjoining property owners requesting that the re-zoning be denied.

Commissioner Hutchins noted that with the railroad right-of-way being on one side of the property and the road right-of-way being on the other side, there is not much that can be done with this property. Commissioner Hawkins asked David Morrow, Vice-Chair of the Planning Board, if he believes that the Planning Board would have made a different decision had they seen the recommendation from Isothermal Planning and Development Commission prior to their meeting. Mr. Morrow stated, "No, I don't think that they would because of the size of the lot."

The background on the property is follows:

Existing Land Use: 1607 is vacant, 10594 has a single family dwelling.

Future Land Use: Heavy Industrial

<u>Utilities:</u> Public water provided by Cleveland County Sanitary District. <u>Transportation:</u> US29- S. Battleground Avenue is considered a major thoroughfare.

He also reviewed the following recommendations from the Planning Board and the Isothermal

Planning & Development consultant:

<u>Isothermal Planning- DENY-</u> Existing land use patterns have some older residential development interspersed with commercial development along South Battleground. However, Cleveland County has proposed the future land use as Heavy Industrial. If the reason for this is to eventually guide future growth of this area to industrial development, then changing the general business designation to residential could impact future plans for industrial development. It will be easier to transition to heavy industrial from general business than from residential. With the current zoning being general business, and the future zoning being industrial, this case would be considered spot zoning (arbitrary) and the County should not approve it.

<u>Planning Board</u> – APPROVE- The Planning Board voted unanimously to recommend this rezoning. This decision was based on the following facts:

The Planning Board voted unanimously to recommend this rezoning, based on the following:

2015 Land Use Plan

This property is located within the I-85/US-29 Industrial Corridor extending from Kings Mountain to Grover. The future land use is projected for Heavy Industry. Changing the zoning to Residential would not comply with the Land Use Plan.

Spot Zoning

The Board considered this small-scale zoning to be reasonable, because of the history of residential use prior to the adoption of zoning in 1992. Also considered, was the small size of the lot, which would not be conducive to heavy industrial use unless it could be incorporated into a larger industrial tract.

Adequate Utilities & Roads

US-29 (Battleground Avenue) is classified by NCDOT as a major thoroughfare. The current traffic volume is 5800 AADT, which is comparable to NC216 in downtown Kings Mountain. Public water and sewer is available along US-29 and Long Branch Road. The restaurant at 1842 recently connected to public sewer.

Adjoining Properties

North: Railroad / JM Huber (surface mining)

South: US-29 / Mini Storage Warehouses & Quality Culvert

East: Vacant

West: Restaurant and Duplex

Statement of Consistency

Recent changes in NCGS 153A-341 now require that the governing board adopt a statement of consistency with the Land Use Plan. These facts may be used to develop a statement, explaining why the board believes the action taken was reasonable and in the public interest.

Chairwoman Boggs opened the public hearing at 7:05. (Notice of this hearing was accomplished in accordance with NCGS 153A-343, with legal ads published in the <u>Star</u> on September 15 and September 22, 2008.) Hearing no comments, Chairwoman Boggs declared the public hearing closed.

<u>ACTION:</u> Johnny Hutchins made a motion to send the request back to the Planning Board to revisit upon receipt of the comments from Isothermal Planning and Development Commission. The motion died of lack of a second.
