WHEREAS, Cleveland County must endorse the agreement between the City of Shelby and NCDOT.

"Welcome to Shelby" signs may be erected at or near municipal/boundary limits at locations approved by NCDOT.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING FIT COMMUNITY SIGN PANELS TO BE INSTALLED ON STATE-MAINTAINED ROADS

WHEREAS, The City of Shelby was designated a Fit Community, a designation recognizing North Carolina communities that have excelled in promoting healthy lifestyles among their residents in areas of physical activity, healthy eating in schools and community, and tobacco prevention efforts with youth; and

WHEREAS, Fit Together, a statewide initiative by the North Carolina Health and Wellness Trust Fund and Blue Cross Blue Shield of North Carolina to combat obesity, launched the Fit community program in 2005 to reward communities for supporting healthy life styles through healthy eating, physical activity and tobacco free living through policy and community infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, a benefit of designation is the posting of Fit Community sign panels to be installed with city limit signs located on state-maintained roads that will be provided by Fit Community and installed by the local division of the North Carolina Department of Transportation.

WHEREAS, the Cleveland County must endorse the location of these signs.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CLEVELAND COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS, NORTH CAROLINA:

ASTHMA AWARENESS MONTH

Anne Short of the Cleveland County Alliance for Health asked Commissioners to adopt a resolution declaring the month of May- Asthma Awareness Month.

<u>ACTION:</u> Ronnie Hawkins made the motion, seconded by Mary Accor and unanimously adopted by the board to *adopt the following resolution:*

NUMBER 16-2009

ASTHMA AWARENESS MONTH MAY, 2009

WHEREAS, asthma has reached epidemic proportions in the United States, affecting about 23 million people nationally and 1.2 million people in North Carolina; and

WHEREAS, asthma is one of the leading causes of childhood hospitalizations, long-term illness, and school absenteeism; and

WHEREAS, asthma is a long-term, inflammatory disease in which the airways of the lungs constrict, causing wheezing, breathlessness, chest tightness and coughing; and

WHEREAS, exposure to allergens and irritants such as dust mites, mold, cockroaches, pet dander, and secondhand smoke can bring on an asthma episode; and

WHEREAS, secondhand smoke worsens children's asthma in up to one million children; and

WHEREAS, the Cleveland County Asthma Coalition in collaboration with the Alliance for Health in Cleveland County and the Board of Health for Cleveland County have implemented basic asthma education classes, a No-Wheeze Asthma Camp, an annual Asthma Expo, an Air Quality Flag program and a Coaches Clipboard program to raise awareness about asthma symptoms, diagnosis and management; and

WHEREAS, the Cleveland County Asthma Coalition, the Alliance for Health in Cleveland County and the Board of Health for Cleveland County encourage residents of Cleveland County, North Carolina to educate themselves about the symptoms of asthma, to identify and reduce their exposure to environmental triggers in homes and schools and to establish asthma management plans for persons diagnosed with asthma;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CLEVELAND COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS, that Cleveland County proclaims May 2009 as Asthma Awareness Month for the county and encourages all residents to participate in events designed to raise community awareness about asthma.

REGULAR AGENDA

TOWNSHIP LINES

Bill McCarter, Planning Director, explained that, for the last twenty years, they have dealt with conflicts between precinct lines and township lines. Each year, the Census Bureau distributes Boundary and Annexation maps to "certify" the location of township and county boundaries. The census bureau never matches the Board of Elections map, primarily, because the township line is an imaginary boundary, with no legal description.

In order to solve this problem before the 2010 Census, the Planning Department recommended that township lines be abolished by resolution (NCGS 153A-19). Mr. McCarter explained that he is not aware of any agency that uses these boundary lines for a regulatory purpose. The board uses them when appointing Boards and Committees. Mr. McCarter suggested that the board use the City Limits when determining geographical locations for Boards and Committees.

Many years ago, each township collected its own taxes and had its own school. Over the years, things have gotten bigger (ex. School System) and there is no reason for townships.

Several Commissioners were concerned about abolishing the townships without additional research.

<u>ACTION:</u> Mary Accor made the motion, seconded by Ronnie Hawkins and unanimously adopted by the board to *table the decision until another meeting*.

COMMISSIONER REPORTS

Commissioner Hawkins:

Commissioner Hawkins spent the day with the Health Department distributing vaccinations to animals for rabies and to adults for whooping cough. He praised the Health Department for their continued pro-active movement to get Cleveland County out from under the rabies problem.

Commissioner Hawkins asked that the board send a letter of thanks to Sam Lockridge and Dorothea Wyant for their work with Vaccination Day.

Commissioner Holbrook:

The Economic Development Team is in the final closing stages of three projects. Commissioner Holbrook suggested that Commissioners, as a show of support, send the prospective clients an email from the Board supporting the projects and the incentive packages being presented to them.

<u>ACTION:</u> Eddie Holbrook made the motion, seconded by Ronnie Hawkins and unanimously adopted by the board to send an email to the three Economic Development clients

supporting their projects and the incentives being presented to them (NOTE: A note was made by Commissioner Holbrook stating that these letters do not substitute as approval of the incentive packages, only support of the conversations).

Commissioner Accor:

Commissioner Accor hosted the first Cleveland County Youth Commission Meeting. Six stakeholders attended the meeting where it was decided that the President of each Senior Class would be asked to serve as an officer of the Commission.

Ms. Accor attended County Assembly Day where they had important dialogue with legislators.

Commissioner Hutchins:

Commissioner Hutchins thanked Commissioner Holbrook, David Dear and the Economic Development Team for their work over the last several weeks. At County Assembly Day, Commissioner Hutchins spoke with Lt. Governor Walter Dalton about Hwy 74 Bypass and suggested that we send a letter to the Lt. Governor asking for help.

<u>ADJOURN</u>

There being no further business to come before the Board at this time, Vice-Chairman Johnny Hutchins made the motion, seconded by Mary Accor, and unanimously adopted by the Board, *to adjourn the meeting* (at 7:00 p.m.). The next regular meeting of the Commission is scheduled for *Tuesday*, *May* 19, 2009 at 6:00 p.m. in the Commission Chamber.
