Karma Edwards, Health Educator compared the distance walked by Step One Participants to

the Nile River, the equator, the East Coast to West Coast of the United States and the Pacific Crest Trail.

She described the Step One Challenge as the largest walking contest in the state and thanked the

<u>REGULAR AGENDA</u>

ONE COMMUNITY ONE READ PROJECT

Carol Wilson, Library Director presented "Ravin' for Poe" a Community Read for Cleveland

County. A Community Read is a program where the entire community reads one book. The most

popular- "The Big Read" is very costly. Ms. Wilson and Sharon Stack (Mauny Memorial Library) have

designed their own program. The program will be held throughout the month of October with activities

including a book discussion, a movie, wine tasting, mystery night for teens and an art crawl. Edgar Allen Poe was chosen because October marks the 200th anniversary of his birth. Ms. Wilson praised the support of several partners including the Cleveland County Arts Council, the Kings Mountain Arts Council and Little Theatre, the Greater Shelby Community Theatre, Cleveland Community College, First National Bank and the Neisler Foundation. The first fifteen-hundred participants will receive a free book.

<u>CLEVELAND COUNTY JURY COMMISSION</u>

<u>ACTION:</u> Mary Accor made the motion, seconded by Johnny Hutchins, and unanimously adopted by the Board, *to re-appoint Ed Smith to serve as a member of this commission*, for a term of two-years, scheduled to conclude on June 30, 2011.

BATTLEGROUND ROAD WATERLINE PROJECT

County Manager David Dear explained that, as part of the incentive agreement to recruit Southern Power Company, Cleveland County agreed to construct a potable waterline to serve the new facility. The design estimated was between \$600,000 and \$700,000. On August 20, 2009, fifteen (15) construction companies submitted bids for the project (*copy of the bid tabulation found on Page*

of Minute Book 31). Bids ranged from a high of \$383,024 to a low of \$262,295.

The low bid was received from Clark Ledbetter Grading of Mooresboro with a bid of \$262,295. Joel Wood, P.E. recommended awarding the project to Clark Ledbetter Grading.

Commissioner Hutchins commented, "I am glad that we can award the project to a local contractor."

<u>ACTION:</u> Johnny Hutchins made the motion, seconded by Mary Accor, and unanimously adopted by the Board, *to approve the award of the bid to Clark Ledbetter Grading in the amount of* \$262,295.

<u>RURAL WATER AND WASTEWATER PROJECTS- GRANT WORKSHOP</u>

Assistant County Manager Eddie Bailes made a short presentation to Commissioners regarding a

Grants Workshop he recently attended. Attendance at this workshop will allow Cleveland County to

earn additional bonus points when applying for grants.

COMMISSIONER REPORTS

Eddie Holbrook reminded Commissioners of the Cleveland County Economic Development

Summit scheduled for September 9, 2009. He noted that there will be representatives from the North

Carolina Department of Commerce, the President of Duke Energy Carolinas and several North Carolina

Economic Development leaders. The purpose is to present Cleveland County and the sites that are

available for economic development.

All Commissioners commended Mary Accor for her swearing in as President of the North Carolina Association of County Commissioners. Commissioner Accor was also asked to serve on the NACo (National Association of Counties) Board of Directors. She will be representing North Carolina through this national organization.

Commissioner Hutchins attended an Rural Planning Organization meeting and stressed the importance in municipalities participating in this program.
