TRANSFER OF PROPERTIES TO THE CITY OF KINGS MOUNTAIN

County Manager David Dear recommended Parcels 7634, 10502, 10507, 10512, 40475 be

transferred to the City of Kings Mountain. A pump station, which is owned by the City of Kings

Mountain for water or sewer infrastructure, is currently located on each of these parcels.

<u>CITIZENS RECOGNITION</u>

STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

State Representative Tim Moore explained that the short session got over quickly due to the fact

that there was no money to spend. The focus was on economic development incentives. He described

the overall theme as "Will it bring jobs and help our state?" Representative Moore thanked

Commissioners and County Manager for their partnership with the state on incentive packages. "We

have already had one great announcement in Clearwater Paper, there are potentially other

announcements to be made." Another bill of importance to Cleveland County was the banning of

electronic sweepstakes. This bill passed outlawing sweepstakes machines in North Carolina. Representative Moore and others in the local delegation will be looking at efforts for additional corporate tax relief during the next session.

STEP ONE CHALLENGE WINNERS

Anne Short, Director of Cleveland County Alliance for Health, thanked Commissioners for their support of the Step One Challenge. She especially thanked them this year for encouraging county employees to participate. Ms. Short noted there were 150 teams comprising of 810 walkers who signed up for the Step One Challenge. HORIZONS BEHAVIORAL HEALTHCARE BOARD APPOINTMENTS

ACTION: Ronnie Hawkins made the motion, seconded by Johnny Hutchins, and unanimously

<u>PLANNING DEPARTMENT: MINIMUM HOUSING CODE VIOLATION: 2408 BERTHA</u> <u>BOYKINS DRIVE</u>

Bill McCarter, Planning Director advised a hearing was held on October 5, 2009 regarding

this case and the owner was allowed 90 days to demolish the dwelling. The order expired January 5,

2010. Mrs. Boykins called the Planning Department and stated that she would find someone to demolish

the dwelling. On June 5, 2010, she contacted Mr. McCarter to report that she was unable to find a

contractor to demolish the home. She asked Mr. McCarter to proceed with demolition.

<u>ACTION:</u> Mary Accor made the motion, seconded by Johnny Hutchins, and unanimously

adopted by the Board, to approve the following ordinance authorizing the demolition of the dwelling.

CLEVELAND COUNTY NORTH CAROLINA

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE CODE ENFORCEMENT OFFICER TO DEMOLISH A DWELLING AT 2408 ELEANOR DRIVE

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 160A, Article 19, Part 6 of the North Carolina General Statutes, the dwelling located at 2408 Eleanor Drive, Cleveland County, North Carolina has been inspected and found to be unfit for human habitation and to otherwise constitute a danger to persons and a threat to the health and welfare of the citizens within Cleveland County; and

WHEREAS, according to the procedures provided by law, the owner(s) of said property have been given notice of the aforesaid inspection, defective conditions, determination and order to bring said property into compliance with the minimum housing code of Cleveland County and the State of North Carolina by appropriate repair and/or demolition of said dilapidated dwelling; and

WHEREAS, the owner(s) have not complied with the Findings and Order by the Code Enforcement Officer within the period allowed by law; and

WHEREAS, the said dwelling remains, at this time, unfit for human habitation, dilapidated, and a danger to the health and safety of the citizens of Cleveland County and should be demolished in order to prevent and alleviate such danger and dilapidated conditions;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CLEVELAND COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS that the dilapidated dwelling located at 2408 Eleanor Drive (Parcel 25260) now or formerly owned by Bertha Boykins, shall be demolished, and a lien placed against the property for the costs incurred by the county as provided by GS160A-446(6).

Adopted and approved this the 17th day of August 2010 by the Cleveland County Board of Commissioners in open session.

PLANNING DEPARTMENT: PETITION FOR ABANDONMENT OF PUBLIC RIGHT OF WAY- BANKS ROAD

Southern Power Company has requested the abandonment of approximately 0.13 miles of

public right-of-way at the end of Banks Road. They own the property on both sides of the road. No other

properties will be affected.
