#### **PUBLIC HEARING**

### ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT~ PROJECT NAVAJO INCENTIVE AGREEMENT

Ken Mooney, CCEDP Manager of Existing Industry, presented an incentive agreement to Commissioners. Project Navajo, now known as Kendrion FAS Controls, will be expanding their operations in Cleveland County. The company is currently located at 1100 Airport Road. Kendrion FAS Controls is a multi-national, German based company. Mr. Mooney highlighted details of the agreement some of which included:

- \$7.5 Million investment in machinery, equipment and building improvements
- 57 new permanent full time jobs

Mr. Mooney explained this was a competitive process and described this as a big win for Cleveland County.

Chairman Hutchins opened the public hearing (public notice was accomplished in accordance with the mandates of NCGS 158-7.1, with an advertisement published in <u>The Star</u> on February 10, 2012).

Allen Langley, 306 Windsor Drive, representing the Cleveland Chamber, spoke in support of the incentive agreement. "What a wonderful opportunity to employ 57 citizens."

Cindy Bailey, 214 S. Lafayette Street, "I have learned a lot about what the Commissioners are doing. I am very pleased with the developments bringing jobs and I fully support the project."

Reverend Robert DeVoe, spoke in support of the project. "Anytime we can bring jobs here, I am for it."

Hearing no other comments, Chairman Hutchins closed the public hearing.

# GOVERNOR'S CRIME COMMISSION GRANT

Lt. John Wright of the Cleveland County Sheriff's Office shared information regarding a grant opportunity through the NC Governor's Crime Commission. The goal of the grant is to establish an intervention program that will intercept and disrupt the illegal use and possession of prescription drugs. The maximum grant award is \$60,000. The county would be required to pay a 25% local match. The grant term is one year with the possibility of reapplying for a second year. The grant cannot be used to purchase, lease or maintain vehicles.

Lt. Wright explained, prescription drug diversion is rapidly becoming the biggest drug problem within Cleveland County. The Sheriff's Office is looking at a multi-faceted approach to this problem; **Education, Partnership, Deterrence and Enforcement.** 

The budget was presented as follows:

Total: \$58,807.24 Federal Share \$44,105.43 Local Match \$14,701.81

The project would include the hiring of one full-time Drug Diversion Investigator (\$41,409.45-salary and benefits included), basic required equipment (\$4,440-sidearm, body armor and portable radio), surveillance equipment (\$7,360-audio/video recording, monitoring equipment) and one part-time investigator (\$6,308-468 hours undercover operations & asset forfeiture).

Chairman Hutchins brought up the idea of possibly using Drug Forfeiture money for the local match and Commissioner Falls mentioned possibly having this match paid for by excess Pathways funding.

<u>ACTION:</u> Jason Falls made the motion, seconded by Mary Accor, and unanimously adopted by the Board, to approve funding the local match, as presented by Lt. Wright.

<u>APPOINTMENT TO PARTNERS BEHAVIORAL HEALTH MANAGEMENT BOARD</u>

The Pathways merger will go into effect in July, 2012. A new board will need to be created to govern the merged agency. The merger committee has asked that Cleveland County's appointments to this board be expedited. Current Pathways board members were asked if they would like to serve on the Partners Behavioral Health Management Board. Carol Ledbetter and Kris Thompson expressed their willingness to serve.

<u>ACTION:</u> Mary Accor made the motion, seconded by Eddie Holbrook, and unanimously adopted by the Board, to appoint Kris Thompson, Carol Ledbetter and Commissioner Jason Falls to serve on the Partners Behavioral Health Management Board. Term expiration will be decided at a later date.

**COMMISSIONER REPORTS** 

Commissioner Holbrook reminded Commissioners, over the last thirty days, three announcements have been made- Baldor, FAS Controls and Project Cardinal. These announcements have secured 430 new jobs for Cleveland County citizens.

On Friday, February 24<sup>th</sup>, the World Series Committee will announce the country music act which will perform at the Fairgrounds during the ALWS.
